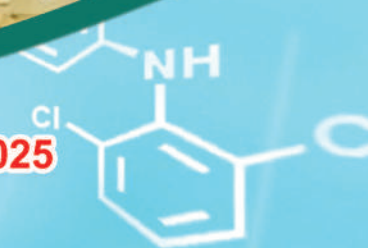

"BREAKING THE BARRIERS AGAINST TB"

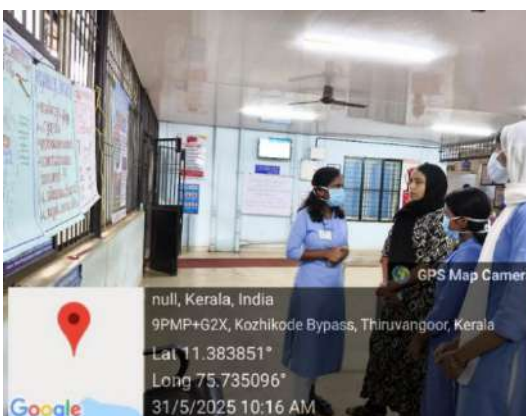

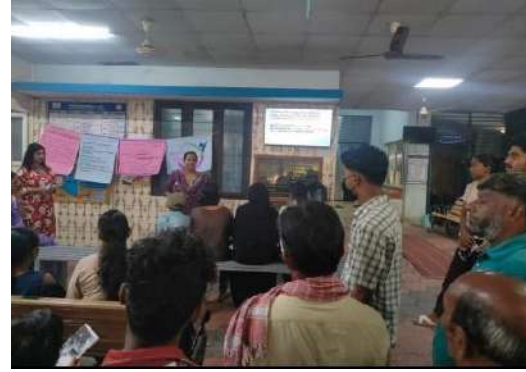
The event fostered active engagement, empowering nursing professionals with cutting-edge knowledge to elevate patient care.

DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY HEALTH NURSING

1.SCHOOL HEALTH PROGRAMME

On 13th February 2025, the Department of Community Health Nursing of Baby Memorial College of Nursing along with its NSS unit, organized a school health programme at Little Flower School in Cheruvannur, Kozhikode district, as part of the "Aswamedham 6.0" - Leprosy Case Detection Campaign (LCDC). The programme included comprehensive health check-ups for approximately 195 students, revealing issues such as mild malnutrition, minor ailments, and dermatological problems.



Referral services were provided, and health education on nutrition and hygiene was delivered. Additionally, hypertension screening was conducted for staff members. The initiative successfully addressed the health needs of students and staff, promoting overall well-being.



2."HEALTH SCREENING AND BLS TRAINING CAMP"

The Department of Community Health Nursing of Baby Memorial College of Nursing organized a health screening camp and Basic Life Support (BLS) training in collaboration with Khadi Gramodyog Emporium, Kozhikode. The camp provided services such as blood sugar and pressure monitoring, obesity risk assessment, and BLS training to 92 beneficiaries.

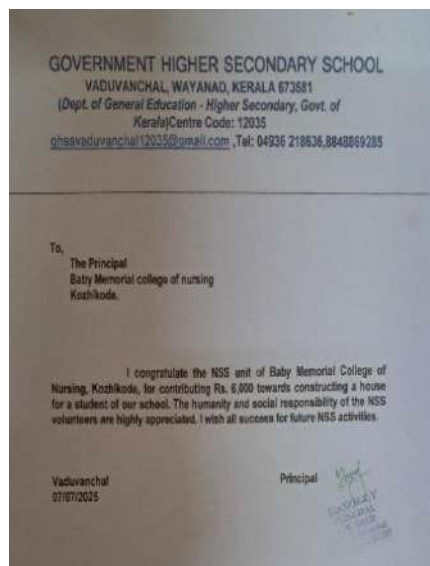

5. ACT OF GENEROSITY

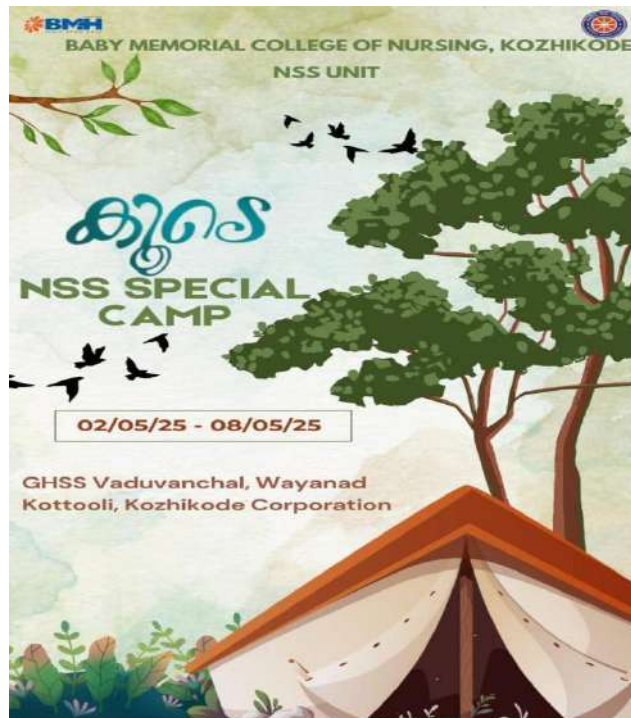

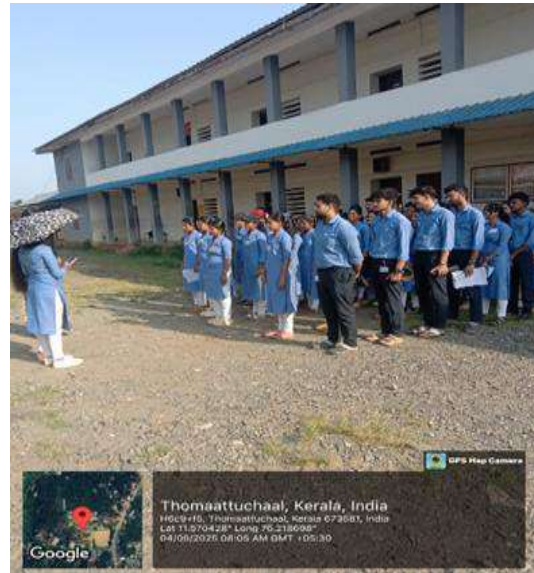

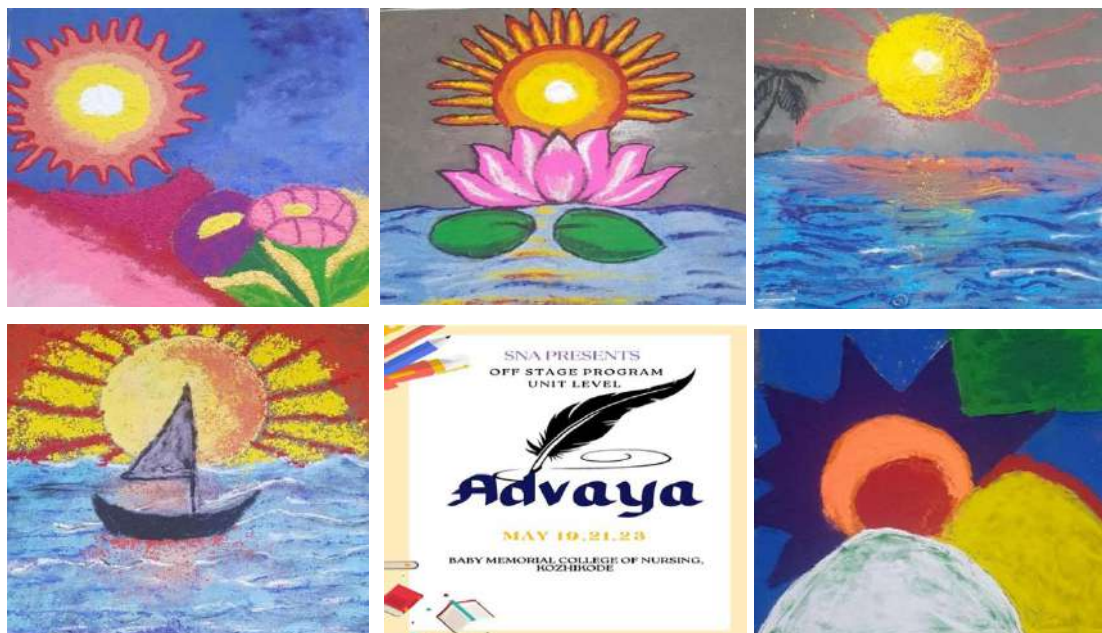
The winners were awarded medals and certificates, marking a triumphant conclusion to the event.
